ARKANSAS ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR COMMON ANIMAL SPECIES

Vesicular Stomatitis (VSV) Entry Requirements – ARKANSAS – Out-of-State attendees and participants. Need Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (with Added Information below) & “Current Coggins” for horses.

No hooved animal may enter Arkansas that has been pastured, housed or had indirect contact during the previous 30 days to an enclosure or any premise currently quarantined for Vesicular Stomatitis (VSV). Affected premises and restricted counties changes constantly. VSV restrictions require an Arkansas issued Entry Permit Number for all hoof stock originating from the County or Adjacent County of any VSV quarantined facility in any affected state(s).

ANY EQUINE (horses, mules, donkeys, miniatures, etc.) **MOVED FROM ANYWHERE WITHIN A VSV QUARANTINED or ADJACENT County in an AFFECTED STATE (KS, MO, OK) to attend an event or to be relocated to Arkansas must be accompanied by: a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) dated within 5 days of movement into Arkansas / from a licensed and USDA Accredited veterinarian in the affected state of origin / with the animal’s Rectal Temperature recorded on the CVI and current EIA/“Coggins” Test results noted with laboratory document verification / and with an Arkansas ENTRY PERMIT NUMBER recorded on the CVI / with the added VSV Statement:**

The following statement is to be added to the CVI and signed by the Attending Veterinarian with that veterinarian’s USDA Accreditation number noted on the CVI:

“All animals individually identified and noted on this Certificate of Veterinary Inspection have been examined by me and found to be free from signs or lesions of vesicular stomatitis virus infection. The Owner of the animals listed has attested to me that these animals have not had direct contact or indirect exposure to any premise quarantined or suspect for presence of vesicular stomatitis within the past 30 days.”

If requirements not met, ALL affected swine must be individually identified, isolated, tested at Seller's expense, and sold for slaughter only at end of sale. ONCE ON SITE, DO NOT LEAVE PREMISES until shipped to slaughter facility.	
Beef Cattle, Bison (buffalo)	No, If state(s) of origin is TB Free.	Yes, unless delivered to Slaughter or Approved Market (Waybill or Owner/ Shipper Agreement required).	Brucellosis - Not required if from Certified Free herd (# on CVI) or Class Free State/Area. If not, all intact cattle > 18 months of age or if already calved or in 3rd stage pregnancy - test in prior 30 days. TB - Must be from TB Free State or Herd (# and test date on CVI) or cervical tested negative within previous 60 days.	Yes, unless delivered to Slaughter /Approved Market (Owner/Shipper required).
