

# Zoonoses: Protecting People and Animals in Rural Communities

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** Zoonotic diseases are an important health risk and concern for rural communities, and can have profound impacts on human health, animal health, food safety, public health, and producer livelihood.

The ***Zoonoses: Protecting People and Animal in Rural Communities*** course overviews the etiology, occurrence and impact of zoonotic diseases of agricultural animals – cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, equids and poultry. The course emphasizes prevention measures to reduce health risks for people and animals. Diseases covered include cryptosporidiosis, salmonellosis, swine influenza, Q fever, rabies, and many more. The course also includes communication tips for promoting zoonotic disease prevention strategies and veterinary practices in rural communities.

This course has been developed for veterinary and animal health professionals, but is applicable to human health and public health professionals or students, or anyone interested in preventing zoonotic diseases.
