As a specialty crop farmer in Arkansas, the use of Dicamba could lead to a huge loss of our crop due to the severity of harm it causes. Losing a large portion of our crop could have a negative impact to employment by causing job loss instead of job opportunity. Dicamba also has a potential to negatively affect our grower's crops and their employees. Losing crops and employment opportunities can be an economic blow to any farming community. This is especially relevant when considering there are safer alternative herbicides available today for use in our Natural State.
